#### STATE OF THE INDUSTRY

- An estimated 671 Mt of total construction aggregates was sold or used in the United States in the third quarter of 2024, a decrease of 7% compared with that in the third quarter of 2023.
- The estimated production for consumption in the first 9 months of 2024 was 1.79 Gt, a decrease of 6% compared with that in the same period of 2023.




# **TRUMP ADMINISTRATION 2**

- What's the same
  - Emphasis on deregulation & energy
  - Seek industry input/address concerns
- What's different
  - Appointees communicators & loyalists
  - Better planning & understanding
  - No concern for re-election



## **CONGRESSIONAL MAKEUP**

- Tight margin in house = major environmental law redo unlikely
- Possible opportunity for minor/bipartisan changes and negotiations
- Republican majorities = little negative oversight

#### **TOOLS FOR RULES**

- Proposals and final rules not yet published are now paused by executive order
- Proposals never finalized can be withdrawn and revised or left to languish
- Final rules need to be repealed and in some cases replaced or Congressional Review Act applied (time limits – won't work for PM or WOTUS)

#### **EXECUTIVE ORDERS & AGGREGATES**

- Department of Government Efficiency
  - Agencies form a DOGE team of at least 4 employees; ends July 4, 2026
- Unleashing American Energy
  - Could remove barriers for extraction of other non energy materials, particularly on federal land
- Ending Government DEI Programs And Preferencing
  - Terminates Environmental Justice offices and actions (as allowed by law)
- International Environmental Agreements
  - Orders agency appointees to withdraw from international climate agreements and funding
- Other orders target Endangered Species Act & Corps Permitting



#### TRUMP'S CABINET PICKS

- Hearings largely positive; likely to be confirmed
- "Back to basics" & Cooperative Federalism (state authority)
- Lee Zeldin, EPA: not former environmental agency staffer or AG, former congressman & ran for NY Governor
- Doug Burgum, Interior (FWS): former ND governor & tech executive





#### **NSSGA EPA EPD UPDATE**

- NSSGA was selected for a \$9.65M, 5-year program from IRA:
  - become the EPD program operator for the aggregates industry
  - provide technical assistance and access to digital solutions for obtaining EPDs


Construction Aggregate PCR







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


#### AIR EMISSIONS REPORTING RULE

- Long time rule requires states to report annual air emissions data to EPA
- 8/23 Proposal would require emitters to determine applicability, track equipment use & report 426 Hazardous Air Pollutants to EPA starting in 2027
- Even to prove non-applicability, \$30,000-\$75,000 per aggregates operation annually (presented in 5/24 meeting with White House reviewing rule)
- Unlikely to be finalized during Trump Administration removed from White House review site

## PM 2.5 STANDARD

- PM 2.5 from 12 ug/m3 to 9 ug/m3 effective 6/24
- Under Clean Air Act, 2 years after final rule, attainment designations made by EPA
- 1.5 years after designations, states submit implementation plans
  - These will include changes to permits to comply with new standard
- Legal challenges: Cost and procedural issues
- Can Trump Administration repeal/lower?
  - Anti-backsliding provisions
  - Is rule final upon effective date or when EPA makes attainment designations?





# WOTUS: SACKETT OPINION

- 5/23: 9-0 SCOTUS finds not a wetland, end Significant Nexus
- 9/23 Final WOTUS
   rule in effect; no
   notice & comment;
   removed SN but left
   terms undefined





#### **POST SACKETT WOTUS**



- Corps used dry continuous surface connection as not requiring water despite SCOTUS "indistinguishable" concept to pull in remote features
- Use of "Coordination Memos"
- Judge in recent Sharfi decision: can't use non jurisdictional to connect jurisdictional
- Executive Order likely forthcoming
- Recommendations (subject to change!) Faithfully Implement Sackett
  - Withdraw coordination memos
  - Clear AJD backlog
  - Revise Biden rule to strengthen & expand exemptions (ephemerals out); "indistinguishable"

#### MULTISECTOR GENERAL PERMIT PROPOSAL

- Only used in 3 states, but informs all state NPDES
- Need to revise per Clean Water Act (every 5 years)
- Permit expires soon, comments due 2/11/25
- Includes new requirements: expanded AIM, Impaired Waters, Storms (PFAS for other industries)
- Did not undergo White House review
- Asked for withdrawal & re-proposal



# **ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT**

- Recent proposals for Monarch Butterfly,
  Hellbender & Rusty Patch Bumblebee; Tricolor Bat limbo
- Proposals unlikely to go final unless court order
- Final rules last year defining critical habitat and other procedural issues may be redone
- People > Fish Executive Order
- ESA Goal: Prevent extinction





# END OF CHEVRON DEFERENCE

- 6/24, SCOTUS Loper Bright ruling ended the legal theory established in Chevron v NRDC (1984)
  - When a rule was challenged, courts would defer to a federal agency's interpretation of authority; now regulated community on more equal footing with regulators
  - Longstanding rules written shortly after laws passed are the most secure (such as Clean Air Act Permitting)
  - Agencies must not use new novel authority of older statutes; less successful "out of the blue" rules
- Congress needs to write clearer laws
- Some "reasonable" rules may face challenges
- Deregulatory efforts may be more difficult
